


Museum Stories October 21, 2020

This week, Museum Stories is about hearts. Take a few minutes to watch the short video.

LOOK

This week we are looking at a black and white picture by Willem de Kooning that doesn't have a title, but sometimes it is called heart graham. What can you see when you look at this picture? Do you see big swirls and splotches of black on white paper? Do any of the swirls and splotches look like something familiar? Can you see a heart?

Here is a fun poem about your heart:
I have a little heart,
And it goes thump, thump, thump.
It keeps right on beating,
When I jump, jump, jump.
I get a special feeling, when I look at you.
It makes me want to give you a hug or two.

This week the first book recommendation is *I Kissed the* Baby by Mary Murphy. This book has big black and white pictures with hearts, just like de Kooning's *Heart Graham*. The second book recommendation, *Kitchen Dance* by Maurie J. Manning is the story of two children who hear noises at night and then find their parents singing and dancing in the kitchen. If you don't have these stories, find another story and take a few minutes to read.
