This week, Museum Stories is about patterns and pumpkins. Take a few minutes to watch the short video.

## LOOK

This week we are looking at a colorful picture by Judy Pfaff. What colors and shapes do you see? Can you find circles, ovals swirls, and even something that looks like a bird? Some of these shapes look like melons, just like the title of the picture. Have you tasted a watermelon, cantaloupe, honey dew or other melons? Do you like the taste? There are lots of colors to find in this picture, too! Can you find the colors red, yellow, blue, green, and orange?

## **READ**

This week the first book recommendation is *Ten Dots* by Donald Crews. This is a great counting book that shows all the things you can make with dots. Can you count or add the dots on each page? Another fun book is *Snappy Halloween*, a pop-up book. There are pumpkins in this book, just like the rounded shapes in Judy Pfaff's picture. If you don't have these stories, find another story and take a few minutes to read.

## **MAKE**

Follow along with the video to color a coloring page inspired by Judy Pfaff or make your own Halloween pumpkin with black dots for counting.
