This week, Museum Stories falls in to autumn. Wander through a seasonal landscape and take a few minutes to watch the short video.

### LOOK

The picture this week has a very long name. The title, *Height of Autumn: On North Fork Mountain looking North to Dolly Sods and Spruce Knob*, tells us where the artist took the photograph. The title is almost as long as the picture itself! Stretch your arms out, how wide can you stretch? What can you find in this photograph? Can you find the trees, mountains, hills, clouds and sky?

This picture was taken in autumn. What does autumn look like? Can you find the leaves turning colors of yellow, brown and red?

### READ

This week, the book recommendation is *Let it Fall* by Maryann Cocoa-Leffler. This explains the season of fall. It describes what to wear and things to do during this cool time of the year. The book demonstrates how nature changes in other parts of the country, since we do not see much change as summer fades to fall in Vero Beach. The book also uses rhymes which help to keep your little one's attention. Take a few minutes to read this story, or another book about fall.

### MAKE

Follow along with the video for instructions on how to make your own fall tree with colorful leaves.
