The Site Visit committee has gotten off to a wonderful start and are focusing our energies during the next few months on sharing with our membership the many VBMA community access programs we can support next year. We are gradually transitioning the name of our committee from "Site Visits" to "Program Observations."

Our January 10th membership meeting allowed us to complete our six program observation teams with four members each. On January 17th, these teams met for orientation/training on the new observational and presentation format. The team members shared ideas, experiences, and team coordinators were selected to facilitate their group's progress. Our successful Pre-K team was able to organize earlier and observe in the fall, when the students attended the program at the VBMA. Working together as a group and learning first hand about these impactful art focused programs has been a rewarding experience for our team members.

Going forward, the teams will be observing their programs in the community during January and February, attending an optional presentation/help workshop on 2/28, and sharing their observations and experiences at our March presentation meeting. We believe these observations will help our Circle Members make informed decisions about which of these wonderful art-focused programs accessible to all in our community they wish to cast their vote to support.

Meet Robyn Orzel

Robyn P. Orzel has served as Director of Development at the Vero Beach Museum of Art for 20 years. Robyn has also led the Museum as the Associate Executive Director for 18 years, working along side former Executive Director Cindy Gedeon and current Executive Director Brady Roberts. Robyn and her Development team of four are responsible for all Museum events, memberships, sponsorships, grants, volunteers, capital campaign support, special projects and, of course, The Circle.

Robyn was born in West Point, New York to a U.S. Air Force family and graduated from Wilkes College in Pennsylvania. She got her feet wet as a Production intern at WNEP-TV in Scranton, PA and began her Museum career at the Dayton Art Institute in Dayton, Ohio. Robyn "does it all" – balancing professional and personal successes while volunteering her time and experience to fellow industry fundraisers.

Twenty years ago, Robyn answered her ringing phone and changed her life, and the life paths of many others. The headhunter who called recruited her to the VBMA and she hasn't looked back. Robyn doesn't like to talk about herself but she has been instrumental in the growth of the VBMA and local arts and culture in and around Vero Beach. She is easily recognizable with her red hair and big personality, but what makes her shine is her strategic approach to non-profit fundraising; growing the endowment; spearheading record setting campaigns, and building confidence among donors and community partners alike.

Robyn proposed The Circle of Friends (now The Circle) in 2009. Members would pool their money to make a greater philanthropic impact for deserving programs. As you know, The Circle has grown and thrived since 2009, and we are so fortunate to have Robyn's direction as we continue on this mission. Robyn shared recently, "I am grateful to The Circle members for 15 seasons of hard but fun work; raising nearly \$500,000 to increase access to art education programs for all community residents. I look forward to what's ahead for The Circle this year and beyond."
