Supply List

An integral part of the uniqueness of COLLAGE is finding, hunting, gathering, exchanging, and fabricating most of the elements for your collages! Many great 'treasures' are found when you least expect it, in the most unlikely places! Collage really is an interactive journey!

Most of the supplies and materials you will need over the course of this class, you probably already have. Please do not spend a lot of money buying items you may not need or use in your solutions. Be sure to use coupons when possible at our local art suppliers. I will have some collage materials to share and use during beginning exercises. You will then begin to incorporate your own materials while developing a personal vision.

With this in mind, two easy tasks done in advance will allow us to jump right in, and make our weekly class sessions very fruitful.

TASK #1

Before Class Starts: FIND+ GATHER

- ~Prepare a personal space to work when the creative juices hit!
- ~Find or make something to transport your work safely from home to class and back.
- ~Find something to keep your supplies and materials safe, available, and easy to transport.
- ~*High Fashion Glossy Magazines to cut up (ie: Nat Geo, Vogue, no keepsakes). (the more the merrier)
- ~Ruler or straightedge.
- ~Scissors, Craft Knife, Box Cutter).
- ~Adhesives (Glues, Sticks, Glue Gun, Rubber Cement, etc.)
- ~Tape, (Masking, Clear, Painters, Any).
- ~Pencils, Erasers, etc.
- ~Tracing/Sketching Paper.
- ~Black Construction Paper 8.5 x11 "some".
- ~Black Sharpie and Black Roller Ball Pen.
- ~Copy Paper (for everything) "some".
- ~Access to a cell phone camera or digital camera.
- *Other materials as needed for completion of individual solutions.

TASK#2

BRING FIRST CLASS MEETING

Cut outs from magazines. Cut as many images as you can, as they relate to a 12x12 picture plane.

You will need a variety of

Small-(approx 1-4 inches in any direction)

Medium-(approx 5-8 inches in any direction)

Large-(approx 8-12 inches in any direction)

These images can be of ANYTHING printed in the magazine!

For example: Animals, people, cars, nature, fashion, appliances, sports.....as long as it has a definable shape. The more you cut out, the more options you will have for future decision-making. Ask friends and family to help! We will also use these cut outs to demonstrate image transferring.
