Plein air is the act of painting outdoors with the artist's subject in full view. Join other plein air artists to capture the spirit and essence of a landscape. Using beautiful, natural resources as subjects, students will assemble at local outdoor locations to find their favorite views to use as inspiration in original sketches and paintings.

Recommended supplies:

- A backpack or rolling cart to put your supplies in
- Portable (plein air) easel
- A lightweight camp chair or stool (if you need to sit)
- Paper towels
- Paints
- Brushes
- Palette
- If you will be using a water media, bring water for that
- Water container
- Spray bottle (if using water media)
- Any other chemicals you use with your medium
- Substrate (i.e., canvas, paper, etc.)
- pencil & erasure
- Vine charcoal (optional)
- Bag for trash

Personal

- Drinking water
- Hat
- Snack if necessary
- Insect repellent
- Umbrella
- Plastic covering for your supplies in case of rain

It is helpful to bring a plastic bag to put wet brushes in at the end of your painting session, as you may have to clean them when you get home.
